7 (1) IN GENERA	L.—Not later than 180 days
8 after the date of the	enactment of this Act, and not
9 less frequently than	every 180 days thereafter, the

President shall submit to the appropriate congres-
sional committees a report—
(A) identifying, for the 180-day period pre-
ceding submission of the report—
(i) any foreign person that has en-
gaged in, or benefitted from, significant
and serial theft of trade secrets of United
States persons, if the theft of such trade
secrets is reasonably likely to result in, or
has materially contributed to, a significant
threat to the national security, foreign pol-
icy, or economic health or financial sta-
bility of the United States;
(ii) any foreign person that has mate-
rially assisted or sponsored such theft;
(iii) any foreign person that has pro-
vided financial, material, or technological
support for, or goods or services in support
of or to benefit from, such theft;
(iv) any entity owned or controlled by
or that has acted or purported to act for
or on behalf of, directly or indirectly, any
foreign person identified under clause (i)
(ii), or (iii); and

1	(v) any chief executive officer or mem-
2	ber of the board of directors of any foreign
3	entity identified under clause (i), (ii), or
4	(iii); and
5	(B) describing the nature, objective, and
6	outcome of the theft of trade secrets each for-
7	eign person described in subparagraph (A)(i)
8	engaged in or benefitted from; and
9	(C) assessing whether any chief executive
10	officer or member of the board of directors de-
11	scribed in clause (v) of subparagraph (A) en-
12	gaged in, or benefitted from, activity described
13	in clause (i), (ii), or (iii) of that subparagraph.
14	(2) Exception.—The President is not required
15	to include in a report required by paragraph (1) the
16	name of any foreign person that is the subject of an
17	active United States law enforcement investigation.
18	(3) FORM OF REPORT.—Each report required
19	by paragraph (1) shall be submitted in unclassified
20	form but may include a classified annex.
21	(b) AUTHORITY TO IMPOSE SANCTIONS.—
22	(1) Sanctions applicable to entities.—In
23	the case of a foreign entity identified under subpara-
24	graph (A) of subsection (a)(1) in the most recent re-

1	port submitted under that subsection, the President
2	shall impose one of the following:
3	(A) Blocking of Property.—The Presi-
4	dent may, pursuant to the International Emer-
5	gency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et
6	seq.), block and prohibit all transactions in all
7	property and interests in property of the entity
8	if such property and interests in property are in
9	the United States, come within the United
10	States, or are or come within the possession or
11	control of a United States person.
12	(B) Inclusion on denied persons
13	LIST.—The President may include the entity or
14	the Denied Persons List maintained by the Bu-
15	reau of Industry and Security of the Depart-
16	ment of Commerce pursuant to section
17	764.3(a)(2) of the Export Administration Regu-
18	lations.
19	(2) Sanctions applicable to individuals.—
20	In the case of an individual identified under sub-
21	paragraph (A) of subsection (a)(1) in the most re-
22	cent report submitted under that subsection, the fol-
23	lowing shall apply:
24	(A) Blocking of Property.—The Presi-
25	dent shall, pursuant to the International Emer-

gency Economic Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et
seq.), block and prohibit all transactions in all
property and interests in property of the indi-
vidual if such property and interests in property
are in the United States, come within the
United States, or are or come within the pos-
session or control of a United States person.

(B) VISA BAN; EXCLUSION.—The Secretary of State shall deny a visa to the individual and revoke, in accordance with section 221(i) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1201(i)), any visa or other documentation of the individual, and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall exclude the individual from the United States.

## (c) Exceptions.—

- (1) Intelligence activities.—This section shall not apply with respect to activities subject to the reporting requirements under title V of the National Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 3091 et seq.) or any authorized intelligence activities of the United States.
- (2) EXCEPTION RELATING TO IMPORTATION OF
  GOODS.—

1	(A) In General.—The authority to im-
2	pose sanctions under paragraph (1)(A) or
3	(2)(A) of subsection (b) shall not include the
4	authority or a requirement to impose sanctions
5	on the importation of goods.
6	(B) Good defined.—In this paragraph,
7	the term "good" means any article, natural or
8	manmade substance, material, supply, or manu-
9	factured product, including inspection and test
10	equipment, and excluding technical data.
11	(3) Exception to comply with inter-
12	NATIONAL AGREEMENTS.—Subsection (b)(2)(B)
13	shall not apply with respect to the admission of an
14	individual to the United States if such admission is
15	necessary to comply with the obligations of the
16	United States under the Agreement regarding the
17	Headquarters of the United Nations, signed at Lake
18	Success June 26, 1947, and entered into force No-
19	vember 21, 1947, between the United Nations and
20	the United States, under the Convention on Con-
21	sular Relations, done at Vienna April 24, 1963, and
22	entered into force March 19, 1967, or under other
23	international agreements.

1	(d) NATIONAL SECURITY WAIVER.—The President
2	may waive the imposition of sanctions under subsection
3	(b) with respect to a person if the President—
4	(1) determines that such a waiver is in the na-
5	tional security interests of the United States; and
6	(2) submits to the appropriate congressional
7	committees a notification of the waiver and the rea-
8	sons for the waiver.
9	(e) Termination of Sanctions.—Sanctions im-
10	posed under subsection (b) with respect to a foreign per-
11	son identified in a report submitted under subsection (a)
12	shall terminate if the President certifies to the appropriate
13	congressional committees that the person is no longer en-
14	gaged in the activity identified in the report.
15	(f) Implementation; Penalties.—
16	(1) Implementation.—The President may ex-
17	ercise all authorities provided under sections 203
18	and 205 of the International Emergency Economic
19	Powers Act (50 U.S.C. 1702 and 1704) to carry out
20	this section.
21	(2) Penalties.—A person that violates, at-
22	tempts to violate, conspires to violate, or causes a
23	violation of paragraph (1)(A) or (2)(A) of subsection
24	(b) or any regulation, license, or order issued to
25	carry out that paragraph shall be subject to the pen-

1	alties set forth in subsections (b) and (c) of section
2	206 of the International Emergency Economic Pow-
3	ers Act (50 U.S.C. 1705) to the same extent as a
4	person that commits an unlawful act described in
5	subsection (a) of that section.
6	(g) Definitions.—In this section:
7	(1) Appropriate congressional commit-
8	TEES.—The term "appropriate congressional com-
9	mittees" means—
10	(A) the Committee on Banking, Housing,
11	and Urban Affairs and the Committee on For-
12	eign Relations of the Senate; and
13	(B) the Committee on Financial Services
14	and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
15	House of Representatives.
16	(2) Export administration regulations.—
17	The term "Export Administration Regulations"
18	means subchapter C of chapter VII of title 15, Code
19	of Federal Regulations.
20	(3) Foreign entity.—The term "foreign enti-
21	ty" means an entity that is not a United States per-
22	son.
23	(4) Foreign person.—The term "foreign per-
24	son" means a person that is not a United States
25	person.

1	(5) Trade secret.—The term "trade secret"
2	has the meaning given that term in section 1839 of
3	title 18, United States Code.
4	(6) Person.—The term "person" means an in-
5	dividual or entity.
6	(7) United States Person.—The term
7	"United States person" means—
8	(A) a United States citizen or an alien law-
9	fully admitted for permanent residence to the
10	United States; or
11	(B) an entity organized under the laws of
12	the United States or of any jurisdiction within
13	the United States, including a foreign branch of
14	such an entity.
